These regulations were made on 27th January, 1986 by the Minister under section 39(1) of the Adoption Act.

Commencement: 1st December, 1987.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Adoption Short title. Regulations, 1986.
- In these regulations "Board" means the Child Care Definition Board as established by the Child Care Board Act.

An applicant under paragraph (1) must cause a medical adoption certificate in Form B to be submitted to the court.

- Where a joint application is submitted, the applicant who is unrelated to the minor must cause a medical certificate in Form B to be submitted to the court; but where one applicant is the natural parent of the minor no medical report is required.
- Subject to paragraph (2), no negotiations arrangements for the adoption of a minor shall be entered into or made by the Board unless

Of Conditions on negotiations or arrangements for adoption.

(a) a person having the lawful care or custody of a minor has requested the Board to enter into or make arrangements for the adoption of that minor; and

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- (b) the parents or guardians of the minor have been furnished with a memorandum as set out in Form C and the parents or guardians have signed and delivered to the Board a certificate as set out in Form D.
- (2) Notwithstanding paragraph (1), the Board may enter into negotiations and make arrangements for the adoption of a minor if
 - (a) the person desirous of adopting a minor, either by himself or jointly with his spouse, is a parent of the minor and has been furnished with a memorandum as set out in Form C and has signed and delivered to the Board the certificate as set out in Form D:
 - (b) the parents or guardians of the minor are unknown and cannot, after reasonable enquiry has been made, be found;
 - (c) the minor has no parents or guardians; or
 - (d) the court has in accordance with section 15(1) of the Act dispensed with the consent of the parents or guardians of the minor.

Request for arrangements for adoption.

- 7. (1) Notwithstanding regulation 6, a person resident in Barbados having care and custody of a minor
 - (a) whom he brought into Barbados under an order issued in another jurisdiction entrusting him with care and custody; or
 - (b) whom the Board is satisfied was, at the date of the application under this regulation, resident in Barbados and was cared, maintained and educated by such person for a period of 3 years prior to the application,

may make application to the Board in Form E requesting the Board to make arrangements for the adoption of such a minor by the applicant alone or jointly with his spouse.

(2) The Board may on receipt of an application under paragraph (1) proceed to make arrangements for the adoption of a minor to whom paragraph (1) (a) or (1) (b) applies.

Information on minor to proposed adopter.

8. (1) The Board shall, at the time a minor is placed for adoption, provide the person who has applied to adopt the minor with written information concerning the minor's background, parentage and his physical, mental and emotional development when this is known.

- (2) The Board shall render, in writing, to a person to whom paragraph (1) applies such other information and advice as it deems appropriate having regard to the particular circumstances of each minor.
- 9. (1) Subject to this regulation, the Board shall in making arrangements for the adoption of a minor cause enquiries and reports to be made in respect of the matters set out in Form F.
 - Enquiries and reports relating to arrangements for adoption
- (2) A report for the purposes of paragraph (1) must be in Form G and must be completed and signed by a registered medical practitioner, and where any question cannot be answered by the practitioner, by reason of lack of information or otherwise he must so indicate thereon.
- (3) The Board shall not, in making arrangements for the adoption of a minor who is in the care and custody of a person other than the person desirous of adopting the minor, either by himself or jointly with his spouse, place such a minor in the care and custody of such person unless
 - (a) the person desirous of adopting the minor has fulfilled the requirements of these regulations;
 - (b) the undertaking as set out in Form H has been signed by
 - (i) the parents or guardians, or
 - the person having care and custody of the minor where the parents or guardians are unknown and cannot after reasonable enquiry has been made or there are no parents or guardians;

and delivered to the Board;

- (c) the person desirous of adopting the minor has been assessed by the Board or in the case where the person desirous of adopting the minor is resident outside of Barbados that person has been assessed by an approved child care agency or institution in his place of residence;
- (d) the Board has caused any premises at which the person desirous of adopting the minor intends that minor to reside permanently to be inspected; and
- (e) the Board has considered any report submitted pursuant to regulation 9.

Visiting of minor etc. after placement.

- 10. (1) Where the Board has placed a minor in the care and custody of an applicant under these regulations the Board shall
 - (a) cause a child care officer to visit such minor at least once in every month for the duration of the probationary period of 6 months after the placement;
 - (b) make adequate arrangements for the supervision of the minor which shall continue until such time as the notice of the appointment of a guardian ad litem is given; and
 - (c) cause the parents or guardians of the minor to be visited or contacted periodically.
- (2) A child care officer who visits a minor pursuant to this regulation
 - (a) may require the person who is given care and custody of the minor not to be present at any place at which he intends to interview the minor; and
 - (b) shall submit a written report to the Board at the end of each such visit.

Records of the Board.

11. The Board must ensure that its records and other documents relating to the Act or these regulations are not accessible to unauthorised persons.

Confidentiality. 12. The members of the Board, the members of any committee of the Board and any person employed by the Board in any capacity shall maintain and aid in the maintenance of the confidentiality in respect of all matters relating to the Act and these regulations and shall not, except with the written consent of the Minister, communicate any such matter to any person unless such communication is for the purpose of giving effect to any provision of the Act or these regulations.

Offences.

- 13. (1) A person who contravenes any provision of an undertaking given in accordance with regulation 9 is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or imprisonment for a term of 3 months.
- (2) A person who contravenes regulation 12 is guilty of an offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

EXPLANATORY MEMORANDUM REGARDING THE ADOPTION OF MINORS

This memorandum must be given to the natural parents, guardian, any person liable by any order or agreement to contribute to the maintenance of, or anyone granted custody of a minor who is about to be adopted.

What Adoption Means

1. Adoption orders are made in the High Court by a Judge. It is a legal procedure by which all your rights and duties as a parent or guardian will be transferred to the adopters who will become the lawful parents of the minor. This means that you will have no further rights to see the minor or to have the minor returned to you.

Your Consent to the Adoption

- 2. Before the Court can make an adoption order, it has to be satisfied that you consent of your own free will to the order being made. Consent cannot be given before the minor is six (6) weeks old. You will be asked to sign a form of consent which will be presented in Court as evidence of your consent. The mother of the minor must sign her consent in the presence of a Justice of the Peace. You are not allowed to sign a blank consent form. The proposed adopters must either be named on the consent form or referred to by number, if they do not wish their identity revealed to you. If they are referred to by number you can ask what sort of people they are and you may choose, if you want, the religious persuasions in which the minor is to be brought up.
- 3. The Court cannot make an adoption order, without your consent unless you have abandoned, neglected or persistently ill-treated or seriously ill-treated the minor, or persistently failed to discharge your parental duties, or neglected or refused to contribute to the maintenance of the minor, or cannot be found, or is incapable of giving consent (for instance by reason of serious mental illness) or is unreasonably withholding consent. If one of these applies to you the Court can dispense with your consent, and will make an adoption order.

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- 4. You will be given notice of the hearing of the application to adopt and will have the opportunity of making your views known to the Court if you so wish. Where the proposed adopters are referred to by a number on the consent form, arrangements will be made for you to attend Court at a different time.
- 5. The Court will appoint a person called the *guardian ad litem* who will need to see you before the Court makes the adoption order to make sure that you understand what the effect will be. The *guardian ad litem* has a duty to ensure that an adoption order will be in the best interest of the minor and the Court must give first consideration to this.
- 6. If you sign the consent form and then, before the adoption order is made, you wish to withdraw your consent, and want the minor back you will have to apply to the Court for leave to remove the minor from the care of the would-be adopters. However, you must show good cause for your decision not to allow the adoption.
- 7. You are not allowed to receive or give any payment or reward in connection with the adoption. This is an offence punishable by law.
- 8. The Child Care Board cannot arrange for the minor to be sent abroad for adoption without a licence from the Chief Justice and here again the licence cannot be granted without your consent except for one of the same sort of reasons as are given in paragraph 3.
- 9. If you have taken out an insurance policy against funeral expenses for the minor, other than one under the *Friendly Societies Act*, Cap. 379, the insurers will be able to tell you whether, after the adoption order is made the policy can be transferred to the adopters should they wish to continue it. If such insurance was taken out under the said Act, the rights and liabilities under the policy will after an adoption order has been made be transferred to the adopters.
- 10. If the minor is entitled to any property rights, the Child Care Board is to be informed of these rights in order for the minor to benefit from such entitlements.
