BARBADOS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
 (QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION)
 ORDER, 1972

Made by the Minister under section 4 (2) of the Barbados Community College Act. Cap. 38.

1. This Order may be cited as the Barbados Community College (Qualifications for Admission) Order, 1972.

2. (1) Subject to this order, the qualifications for admission to and as a student of the College are passes at Ordinary Level in the General Certificate of Education in not less than four subjects obtained at one or more sittings of any one of the examining bodies set out in the Schedule or any other examining body approved by the Minister after consultation with the Board. 1975/141.

(2) For the purposes of sub-paragraph (1), any of the following qualifications shall be deemed to be equivalent to a pass at Ordinary Level in the General Certificate of Education—

- (a) a pass in any academic subject of—
 - (i) the London Chamber of Commerce,
 - (ii) the Pitmans Examination Institute, or
 - (iii) the Royal Society of Arts, at Intermediate or any higher level;
- (b) a Grade VI or higher pass in Art of the Royal Drawing Society;
- (c) a pass in Music of the Associated Board of the Royal Schools of Music Grade 8 Theory plus Grade 6 or any higher Practical or a pass of the Trinity College of Music Grade V or any higher Practical plus senior Theory;
- (d) a certificate in Domestic Science obtained after one year's study at the Barbados Housecraft Centre;

- (e) a pass in Domestic Science (Domestic Cookery and Home Management) of the City and Guilds of London Institute.
- (f) a pass in any subject other than that specified in (e) of this sub-paragraph of the City and Guilds of London Institute.

3. Notwithstanding paragraph 2, a person who has passes in—

- (a) Typewriting at the Elementary Stage;
- (b) Shorthand at 60 words per minute; and
- (c) any two subjects at Ordinary Level in the General Certificate of Education or the equivalent thereto as set out in paragraph 2,

may be admitted as a student of the College to the Secretarial Course in the Division of Commerce.

4. (1) The qualifications for admission to and as a student of the College in Scheme A of the division of Technology are the qualifications mentioned in paragraph 2 in—

- (a) Elementary Mathematics;
- (b) any two of the following subjects—
 - (i) Additional Mathematics;
 - (ii) Physics;
 - (iii) English Language;
 - (iv) English Literature;
 - (v) Engineering Drawing;
 - (vi) General Science;
 - (vii) Physics with Chemistry;
 - (viii) Geography; and
- (c) one other subject.

(2) Notwithstanding paragraph 2 and sub-paragraph (1) of this paragraph, a person who—

- (a) holds the City and Guilds of London Institute Advanced Craft Certificate;

- (b) has successfully completed an Advanced Craft Course at the Samuel Jackman Prescod Polytechnic; or
- (c) has passed such examination as the Board considers equivalent to a qualification mentioned in (a) or (b) of this sub-paragraph,

may be admitted as a student of the College to Scheme B of the Division of Technology.

5. (1) The qualifications for admission to and as a student of the College in the diploma course of the Community Services Division are the qualifications mentioned in paragraph 2. 1974/138.

- (2) A person who—
 - (a) holds a School Leaving Certificate;
 - (b) has successfully completed courses of study up to school-leaving age; or
 - (c) has passed such examination as the Board considers equivalent to a qualification mentioned in (a) or (b) above,

may be admitted as a student to the certificate course of the Community Services Division.

(3) Notwithstanding sub-paragraph (1), a student who has successfully completed the certificate course referred to in sub-paragraph (2) and who has attained in that course a standard satisfactory to the Board, may be admitted to the diploma course referred to in sub-paragraph (1).

6. (1) The qualifications for admission to and as a student of the College in the Health Sciences Division shall be—

- (a) for the Pre-Health Service course, a pass in not less than two subjects in the General Certificate of Education at ordinary level or in any other examination that the Board determines to be equivalent thereto;
- (b) for the Health Aide course, those qualifications specified in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 5;
- (c) for any health science course other than those mentioned in sub-paragraphs (a) and (b), the qualifications specified in paragraph 2.

(2) Notwithstanding sub-paragraph (1) (c), a person who has successfully completed the Pre-Health Service course may be eligible for admission to a health science course other than those mentioned in paragraphs (a) and (b).

7. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in this order—
- (a) the Board may require any person who seeks admission to any division of the College to take such examinations in such subjects as the Board considers necessary to enable it to determine his eligibility for admission to that division;
 - (b) the Board may, after consultation with the Minister, recognise any other suitable qualification to be of equivalent status to the qualification necessary for admission to any division of the College.

(2) A person who passes any examination required by the Board under sub-paragraph (1) may be admitted to the division of the College to which he seeks admission.
