CUSTOMS (TRANSIT GOODS) REGULATIONS. 1984 -

1984/89.

Authority: These regulations were made on 23rd May, 1984 by the Minister under sections 98 and 241 of the Customs Act.

Commencement: 31st May, 1984.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Customs (Transit Goods) Regulations, 1984.
- 2. The Minister responsible for Defence is hereby designated as the licensing authority for the purposes of any transit goods to which these regulations relate.
- **3.** (1) No person shall import or export any transit goods specified in the Schedule unless he first obtains a licence from the schedule. Minister responsible for Defence.

- (2) A licence for the purposes of these regulations must be in such form as the Minister responsible for Defence determines.
- (3) A person who imports or exports any transit goods specified in the Schedule without a licence is guilty of an offence schedule. and liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or imprisonment for 3 months or both.

SCHEDULE

(Regulation 3)

1. Arms and ammunition any other munitions of war including the whole or any part of a ship, submarine, aircraft, tank or other vehicle, torpedo, mine and any other similar or dissimilar device or material that is likely to be used for the purpose of the foregoing.

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
