CUSTOMS (TRANSIT GOODS) REGULATIONS,
1984 -

1984/89.

Authority: These regulations were made on 23rd May, 1984 by the Minister under sections 98 and 241 of the *Customs Act*.

Commencement: 31st May, 1984.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Customs (Transit Goods) Regulations, 1984*.

2. The Minister responsible for Defence is hereby designated as the licensing authority for the purposes of any transit goods to which these regulations relate.

3. (1) No person shall import or export any transit goods specified in the *Schedule* unless he first obtains a licence from the Minister responsible for Defence. Schedule.

(2) A licence for the purposes of these regulations must be in such form as the Minister responsible for Defence determines.

(3) A person who imports or exports any transit goods specified in the *Schedule* without a licence is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or imprisonment for 3 months or both. Schedule.

SCHEDULE

(Regulation 3)

1. Arms and ammunition any other munitions of war including the whole or any part of a ship, submarine, aircraft, tank or other vehicle, torpedo, mine and any other similar or dissimilar device or material that is likely to be used for the purpose of the foregoing.

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
