**DEFENCE (CERTIFICATES OF ARREST AND
SURRENDER OF DESERTERS AND
ABSENTEES) REGULATIONS, 1984**

1984/162.

Authority: These regulations were made on 6th June, 1984 by the Defence Board under section 224 of the *Defence Act*.

Commencement: 6th June, 1984.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the *Defence (Certificates of Arrest and Surrender of Deserters and Absentees) Regulations, 1984*. Short Title.

2. Where pursuant to section 178 of the *Act* a magistrate's court has dealt with a person as illegally absent the certificate required by subsection (1) of section 180 of the *Act* to be handed over when the person is delivered into military custody must be in the form specified in Part I of the *Schedule* and must contain the particulars therein set out as to the person's arrest and surrender and of the proceedings before the court. Certificate for Magistrate's court. Schedule.

3. Where under section 179 of the *Act* a person is delivered into military custody without being brought before a magistrate's court the certificate required by subsection (2) of section 180 of the *Act* to be handed over must be in the form specified in Part II of the *Schedule* and must contain the particulars therein set out relating to the person's surrender. Certificate of Police. Schedule.

4. Where a person has been taken into military, naval or air force custody on arrest or surrender the certificate required by paragraph (b) of subsection (3) of section 180 of the *Act* must be in the form specified in Part III of the *Schedule* and must contain the particulars therein set out relating to the person's surrender or arrest. Surrender. Schedule.
