DIPLOMATIC IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES S.I.
(**CARIBBEAN TOURISM RESEARCH CENTRE**) 1976/110.
ORDER, 1976

Made by the Minister under section 6 of the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act. Cap. 18.

1. This Order may be cited as the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges (Caribbean Tourism Research Centre) Order, 1976. Short title.

2. For the purposes of this order, "the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre" means the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre established by the Agreement signed at Bridgetown, Barbados, on the 9th day of September, 1975. Interpretation.

3. For the purposes of Part III of the Act, it is hereby declared that the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre is an organisation of which the Government of Barbados and the Governments of other sovereign Powers are members. Application of section 6 of the Act.

4. The Caribbean Tourism Research Centre shall have the legal capacity of a body corporate. Legal capacity of Centre.

5. (1) The Caribbean Tourism Research Centre shall have the immunities and privileges set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to the Act, but the immunity from suit and legal process conferred on the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre by this order shall not include immunity from suit and legal process in respect of— Immunities and privileges of Centre.

- (a) a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by a motor vehicle belonging to or operated on behalf of the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre or in respect of a traffic offence involving such a motor vehicle; and
- (b) arbitration proceedings relating to any written contract

entered into by or on behalf of the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre.

(2) Nothing contained in sub-paragraph (1) shall be construed as authorising the enforcement of any judgment or arbitration award by execution on the premises or official archives of the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre.

6. (1) Officers of the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre holding the offices of Executive Director, Director of Research, Sociologist, Hotel Adviser and Tourism Analyst shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act.

(2) Officers and servants of the Caribbean Tourism Research Centre, other than those specified in sub-paragraph (1), shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act, except immunity from suit or legal process in respect of a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by motor vehicles belonging to or driven by them, or in respect of traffic offences involving such motor vehicles.
