**DIPLOMATIC IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES
 (LATIN AMERICAN ENERGY ORGANISATION)
 ORDER, 1976**

Made by the Minister under section 6 of the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act. Cap. 18.

1. This Order may be cited as the Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges (Latin American Energy Organisation) Order, 1976. Short title.

2. For the purposes of this order, "the Latin American Energy Organisation" means the Latin American Energy Organisation established by the Agreement signed at Lima, Peru, on the 2nd day of November, 1973. Interpretation.

3. For the purposes of Part III of the Act, it is hereby declared that the Latin American Energy Organisation is an organisation of which the Government of Barbados and the Governments of other sovereign Powers are members. Application of section 6 of the Act.

4. The Latin American Energy Organisation shall have the legal capacity of a body corporate. Legal capacity of Organisation.

5. (1) The Latin American Energy Organisation shall have the immunities and privileges set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to the Act, but the immunity from suit and legal process conferred on the Latin American Energy Organisation by this order shall not include immunity from suit and legal process in respect of— Immunities and privileges of Organisation.

(a) a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by a motor vehicle belonging to or operated on behalf of the Latin American Energy Organisation or in respect of a traffic offence involving such a motor vehicle; and

- (b) arbitration proceedings relating to any written contract entered into by or on behalf of the Latin American Energy Organisation.

(2) Nothing contained in sub-paragraph (1) shall be construed as authorising the enforcement of any judgment or arbitration award by execution on the premises or official archives of the Latin American Energy Organisation.

6. (1) The Executive Secretary, and representatives (whether of Governments or not) on any organ of the Organisation, or members of any committee of the Organisation or any organ thereof shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act.

(2) Officers and servants of the Latin American Energy Organisation other than those specified in sub-paragraph (1) shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act except immunity from suit or legal process in respect of a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by motor vehicles belonging to or driven by them, or in respect of traffic offences involving such motor vehicles.
