INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES OF THE INTER-AMERICAN INSTITUTE FOR COOPERATION ON AGRICULTURE) ORDER, 1987

S.I. 1987/61.

Authority: This order was made on 27th January, 1987 by the Minister under section 6 of the *Diplomatic Immunities and Privileges Act*.

Commencement: 13th April, 1987.

1. This Order may be cited as the *International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges of the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture) Order, 1987*. Short title.

2. For the purposes of this order
“Institute” means the Inter-American Institute for Cooperation on Agriculture established by the agreement signed at Bridgetown, Barbados on the fourteenth day of February, one thousand, nine hundred and eighty-six. Interpretation.

3. For the purposes of Part III of the Act, it is declared that the Institute is an organisation of which the Government of Barbados and the Governments of other sovereign powers are members. Application of section 6 of the Act.

4. The Institute has the legal capacity of a body corporate. Legal capacity.

5. (1) The Institute has the immunities and privileges set out in Part I of the Second Schedule to the Act but the immunity from suit and legal process conferred on the Institute by this Order does not include immunity from suit and legal process in respect of Immunities and privileges.

(a) a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by a motor vehicle belonging to or operated on behalf of the Institute in respect of a traffic offence involving such a motor vehicle; and

(b) arbitration proceedings relating to any written contract entered into by or on behalf of the Institute.

(2) Nothing contained in sub-paragraph (1) shall be construed as authorising the enforcement of any judgment or arbitration award by execution on the premises or official archives of the Institute.

THE LAWS OF BARBADOS

6. (1) The Director-General and the Representative of the Institute in Barbados shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part II of the Second Schedule to the Act.

(2) Officers and servants of the Institute other than those specified in sub-paragraph (1), shall, if they are not citizens of Barbados, have the immunities and privileges set out in Part III of the Second Schedule to the Act except immunity from suit or legal process in respect of a civil action for damage alleged to have been caused by motor vehicles belonging to or driven by them, or in respect of traffic offences involving such motor vehicles.
