DRUG SERVICE (BARBADOS NATIONAL DRUG FORMULARY) (APPROVAL) ORDER, 2014

The Minister, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 5(3) of the *Drug Service Act*, makes the following Order:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the *Drug Service (Barbados National Drug Formulary) (Approval) Order, 2014.*
- **2.** The 33rd Edition of the Barbados National Drug Formulary is approved for publication.
- 3. The items set out in the *Schedule* are approved for removal from the Barbados National Drug Formulary and shall not be included in the 33rd Edition of the Barbados National Drug Formulary.

SCHEDULE

(Paragraph 3)

Drugs not included in the 33rd Edition of the Barbados National Drug Formulary

1. DIHYDROERGOTAMINE/PROPYPHENAZINE/CAFFEINE

Indications: A minority of patients suffering from migraine and cluster headaches who are resistant to paracetamol, soluble aspirin.

Cautions/Side Effects: Nausea, vomiting, headache.

Dose:

Adults and children 12 years: 1-2 tablets, a further tablet may be taken after 20-30 minutes if necessary up to a maximum of 6 tablets in 24 hours.

Preparations:

125mg P/ 0.5mg D/ 40 C Tablet

*Tonopan (NVS/COL); 0.2960 per Tab (20)

2. DOXAPRAM HYDROCHLORIDE

Indications: Treatment of respiratory depression or apnea following anaesthesia.

Cautions/Side Effects: Increase in blood pressure and heart rate, dizziness, perianal warmth.

Dose Range: i.v. infusion: 1.5-4mg per minute according to patient's response.

Preparations:

20mg/ml Inj. 20ml Amp.

*Doxapram (BEV/LAS); 219.8700 per Amp

3. HYOSCINE BUTYLBROMIDE - PARACETAMOL

Indications: Peptic ulcer, oesophageal and pylorospasm, spastic colon.

Cautions/Side Effects: As for Atropine.

Dose:

Adults and Paediatrics over 6 years: 1-2 tablets. Not recommended for chronic use.

Preparations:

Tablet, 10mg HB/500mg P

*Buscopan Plus (BOE/STO); 0.5045 per Tab (30)

4. MENOPAUSAL PREPARATIONS

Indications: Symptoms due to oestrogenic deficiency and for the prophylaxis of postmenopausal osteoporosis in women at risk of developing fractures.

Cautions/Side Effects: Headaches, dizziness, nausea, changes in bleeding patterns. Do not chew tablets, swallow whole.

Dose Range: 1 tablet daily.

Preparations:

Oestradiol/Cyproterone Acetate (Progesterone Derivative)

5. NORTRIPTYLINE HCL- FLUPHENAZINE HCL

Indications: Anxiety with depression.

Dose Range: Adult: 1 tablet 3 times daily.

Preparations:

10mg N/500mcg F

Consult the BDS for supplies. (No offers to Supply)

6. PIZOTIFEN (PIZOTYLINE)

Indications: Prophylaxis of migraine headache, in refactory or intolerant patients.

Cautions/Side Effects: Increase in appetite - frequently causes weight gain. Should be taken at night to avoid sedation.

Dose:

Adult: 3 tablets at night or 1 tablet 3 times daily (maximum 4.5mg). Paediatric over 2 years: up to 1.5mg daily in divided doses (maximum 1mg at night as a single dose).

Preparations:

0.25mg Tablet

Consult the BDS for supplies. (No offers to Supply)

7. PROPANTHELINE BROMIDE

Indications: Peptic ulcer and spastic colon.

Cautions/Side Effects: Mild anticholinergic. Dry mouth. Difficulty with micturition, sexual activity. Do not take with antacids. Take 30-60 minutes before meals.

Dose Range: Adults and Paediatrics over 12 years: 15mg 3 times daily as necessary.

Preparations:

Tablet, 15mg

Consult the BDS for supplies.

8. SODIUM AUROTHIOMALEATE

Indications: Lead poisoning.

Cautions/Side Effects: Anuria, renal and hepatic disease.

Dose Range: Adult: 40mg/kg twice daily in N/S or 5% I.V. glucose infusion for up to 5 day, repeated if necessary after 48 hours.

Preparations:

Inj. 20%, 5ml Amp.

9. TOPIRAMATE (B)

Indications: Lennox-Gastaut syndrome, migraine prophylaxis, partial seizure and tonic-clonic seizure as adjunct or monotherapy.

Cautions/Side Effects: Anemia, increased body temperature, dyspnea, hepatitis, hypohidrosis, leucopenia, liver failure.

Dose:

Migraine prophylaxis: Initially 25mg at night to a usual dose of 50mg twice a day. **Seizures**: Initially 25-50mg at night for 1 week increased by increments of 25-50mg at intervals of 1-2 weeks to the usual maintenance dose for adjunctive therapy of 200-400mg in divided doses. **Monotherapy**: 100-500mg daily. **Child 2-16 years**: initially 25mg at night for 1 week increased by 1-3mg/kg every 1 or 2 weeks (in 2 divided doses) to the usual maintenance dose for adjunctive therapy of 5-9mg/kg daily.

Preparations:

25mg Tablet

*Topiramate (PMS/COL); 0.1394 per Tab (90)

50mg Tablet

*Topiramate (PMS/COL); 0.4467 per Tab (90)

100mg Tablet

*Topiramate (PMS/COL); 0.4610 per Tab (120)

10. TRIMIPRAMINE MALEATE

Indications: Depression. Particularly useful in the elderly.

Cautions/Side Effects: See amitriptyline hydrochloride. c.f. prescribing in liver disease p. 18.

Dose Range: 50-75mg daily as a single dose 2 hours before bedtime. Maximum 300mg daily. Maintenance dose 75-150mg daily.

Preparations:

Tablet, 25mg
