ELECTRICAL WIREMEN (LICENSING) RULES, 1976

Authority:

These rules were made on 1st March, 1976 by the Board and approved by the Minister under section 18(1) of the Electrical Wiremen (Licensing) Act.

Commencement: 1st March, 1976.

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the Electrical Wiremen (Licensing) Rules, 1976.
 - 2. Any person who complies with section 5 of the Act, and
 - (a) has 10 years practical experience as a wireman; or
 - (b) possesses
 - (i) the Intermediate Certificate in courses A and B of the City and Guilds Certificate, London, or
 - (ii) a Certificate awarded by the Council after having passed an examination set by the Council, and has at least 3 years practical experience as a wireman,

may be granted a licence to practise as a wireman.

- 3. A person who has at least 3 years but less than 10 years practical experience as a wireman and satisfies the requirements of section 8A of the Act may be granted a licence to practise as a licensed person.
- 4. The fee payable in respect of an examination set pursuant to section 9 of the Act is \$10.
