EXPULSION OF UNDESIRABLES
(CARMEN BAILEY) ORDER, 1973

S.I.
1973/119.

26th July, 1973

WHEREAS by section 2 of the Expulsion of Undesirables Act it is provided, *inter alia*, that, if it appears to the Governor-General that it is expedient for the preservation of the peace and good order of the Island that any person should be required to leave the Island, the Governor-General may, if he thinks fit, make an order (in the Act referred to as an expulsion order) requiring such person to leave the Island within the time fixed by the order, and thereafter to remain out of the Island:

AND WHEREAS by section 4 of the said Act it is provided *inter alia*, that it shall be lawful for the Governor-General, if he thinks fit, in an expulsion order, instead of requiring the person against whom it is made to leave the Island within a fixed time, to order that the person be arrested and deported from the Island in such manner as the Governor-General may direct:

AND WHEREAS it appears to the Governor-General that it is expedient for the preservation of the peace and good order of the Island that Carmen Bailey who is not a citizen of Barbados, should be required to leave the Island:

NOW THEREFORE the Governor-General in exercise of the powers conferred on him by sections 2 and 4 of the Expulsion of Undesirables Act hereby orders as follows—

1. This Order may be cited as the Expulsion of Undesirables (Carmen Bailey) Order, 1973.

2. Carmen Bailey is hereby ordered to be arrested and deported forthwith from the Island.

3. This Order comes into operation on the date of the making thereof.
