## FISHERIES (FISHING INDUSTRY) REGULATIONS, 1952<sup>1</sup>

Vol. 1952, p. 373. 1993-6.

Authority: These regulations were made on the 11th September, 1952 by the Minister under section 21 of the Fishing Industry Act, Cap. 262.

Commencement: 11th September, 1952.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Fisheries (Fishing Industry) Regulations, 1952.
- 2. The Register of fishing vessels shall contain the particulars set out in Part I of Form A in the *Schedule* in respect of each fishing vessel schedule. registered under the provisions of the Act.
- 3. (1) Every certificate of registration issued by the Chief Fisheries Officer shall be as in Part II of Form A in the Schedule. Schedule.
- (2) In addition to the provisions of the Act relating to the sale or change of ownership of a fishing vessel, the owner of a fishing vessel in respect of which any particulars of registration shall be or become incorrect, shall, within 1 month of such particulars being or becoming incorrect, notify the Chief Fisheries Officer of the correct particulars, and the Chief Fisheries Officer shall on receipt of such notification amend the certificate of registration accordingly.
- (3) The owner of a fishing vessel who fails to comply with the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence and on summary conviction be liable to a penalty not exceeding \$10.
- 4. The owner of every fishing vessel registered under the Act shall paint or cause to be painted on the outer side of the transom in figures each of which shall not be less than 6 inches in height and 4 inches in width a number corresponding with the registration number of such fishing vessel.

These regulations were saved under section 47 of the Fisheries Act, 1993 (Act 1993-6).

#### 5. No person shall

- (a) paint or cause to be painted on the transom of any fishing vessel any number other than the registration number of such fishing vessel;
- (b) use the registration number assigned to any fishing vessel in respect of any other fishing vessel.
- 6. (1) The registration number assigned to a fishing vessel shall be and remain the registration number of such fishing vessel so long as the same shall continue to be registered, and may not be altered without the permission of the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- (2) In the event of the Chief Fisheries Officer authorising the alteration of the registration number of a fishing vessel, he shall assign to such fishing vessel a new registration number which shall thereupon be deemed to be the registration number of such fishing vessel.
- 7. The owner of a fishing vessel shall, if required so to do by the Chief Fisheries Officer, submit such fishing vessel for inspection at the time and place named by the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- 8. (1) Every licence issued to a person exercising the trade or schedule. calling of a fisherman shall be in the Form B in the Schedule.
  - (2) The Register of licences shall contain the particulars and be as in the Form C in the Schedule.

#### PART II (cont'd)

THE ATTENTION of owners of Local Fishing Vessels is directed to the following requirements -

- 1. Every local fishing vessel is required to be registered, lettered and numbered and to have a certificate of registry in accordance with section 18 of the *Fisheries Act*, Cap. 391.
- Any alterations in the particulars on the certificate shall be immediately notified to the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- 3. On a change of ownership of any vessel, the new owner must make application for the registry of the vessel, and the previous owner must deliver up the old certificate of registry to the Chief Fisheries Officer for cancellation.
- 4. When a vessel is lost or ceases to be a local fishing vessel the owner must immediately give notice to the Chief Fisheries Officer.
- 5. Owners are responsible for having the letters and numbers detailed to their vessel conspicuously painted on the outerside of the transom of the vessel in figures not less than 6 inches long.

Any person who fails to observe the Regulations renders himself liable to a penalty. If the Certificate of Registry is lost the owner must make immediate application for another.
