**HEALTH SERVICES (CONTROL OF THE USE
OF ARTIFICIAL SWEETENERS IN FOOD)
REGULATIONS, 1970**

S.I. 1970/110.
1978/111.

Made by the Minister under section 10 of the Health Services Act. Cap. 44.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Health Services (Control of the Use of Artificial Sweeteners in Food) Regulations, 1970.

2. For the purposes of these regulations—
“artificial sweetener” means calcium cyclamate, magnesium cyclamate, potassium cyclamate, sodium cyclamate or any other substance derived from cyclamic acid.

3. (1) Subject to the provisions of this regulation, no person shall—

- (a) use or permit to be used any artificial sweetener in the composition or preparation of any article of food or drink intended for sale or sold for human consumption; or
- (b) sell, offer for sale or have in his possession for sale for human consumption any article of food or drink containing any artificial sweetener.

(2) Paragraph (1) shall not apply to the sale or supply of any artificial sweetener not contained in food or drink and manufactured or produced for medicinal purposes only:

Provided that such artificial sweetener is sold or supplied in a container bearing a label clearly marked “CAUTION—contains Cyclamate; to be used only under medical supervision”.

4. Any substance containing or suspected of containing any artificial sweetener shall be deemed to be an article to which

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regulations 13, 14, 15 and 16 of the Health Services (Control of Drugs) Regulations, 1970 apply.

S.I. 1978/111. **5.** A person who contravenes these regulations is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding five thousand dollars or imprisonment for a term not exceeding twelve months, or both, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further fine not exceeding two hundred dollars for each day or part thereof during which the offence continues after a conviction is first obtained.
