- **1.** These Regulations may be cited as the *Miscellaneous Controls* (*Importation and Exportation of Goods*) (*Prohibition*) Regulations, 1971.
 - **2.** For the purposes of these Regulations,
- "military equipment" includes any equipment, materials, plants or machinery which in the opinion of the Comptroller of Customs is designed or intended for the manufacture or maintenance of arms or ammunition;

"scheduled country" means a country specified in the First Schedule. First

- 3. No person shall import into Barbados
- (a) any goods from;
- (b) any goods which have been produced, manufactured or processed in;
- (c) any arms or military equipment intransit or in transhipment to;
- (d) any goods falling under tariff heading number 84.01 of the 1994/15. Customs Tariff (Amendment) Order, 1993 produced in or 1993/34. transhipped from

any scheduled country.

4. For the purposes of these Regulations any label, mark, description or other sign indicating that an article was produced, manufactured or processed in a scheduled country shall be *prima facie* evidence that such article was produced, manufactured or processed in that country.

- **5.** (1) No person shall export from Barbados
- (a) any goods to;
- (b) any goods to any country with the intent to tranship or cause such goods to be transhipped to; or
- (c) any arms or military equipment intransit or in transhipment to any scheduled country.

(2) Regulations 3(a), 3(b), 5(1)(a) and 5(1)(b) shall not apply to South Africa.

- **6.** Any person who
- (a) imports or exports or attempts to import or export any goods, arms or military equipment; or
- (b) imports or attempts to import goods falling under tariff heading number 84.01 of the Customs Tariff (Amendment) Order, 1993

in contravention of these Regulations is guilty of an offence and liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding \$5 000 or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 12 months, and the goods, arms military equipment or goods falling under tariff heading number 84.01 of the *Customs Tariff (Amendment) Order*, 1993 may be forfeited as the court thinks fit.

6A. (1) Notwithstanding regulation 5, the Minister may on the application by any person to that effect grant a licence subject to any conditions specified in the licence in respect of the exportation of goods to any country set out in the *Second Schedule*.
