PHARMACY (AUTHORISED SELLERS OF POISONS) REGULATIONS, 1986

1986/81. 1993/33.

Authority: These Regulations were made on 21st May, 1986 by the Pharmacy Council, with the approval of the Minister, under section 34 of the Pharmacy Act.

Commencement: 26th May, 1986.

- **1.** These Regulations may be cited as the *Pharmacy* (Authorised Short title. Sellers of Poisons) Regulations, 1986.
- 2. (1) An application from a person other than a pharmacist to be Application registered as an authorised seller of poisons shall be made to the Council in the Form set out in the First Schedule.

- (2) A person who makes application to the Council under paragraph (1) is entitled to be registered as an authorised seller of poisons if he satisfies the Council that
 - (a) he has paid the fee prescribed under section 28(2) of the Act;
 - (b) he is able to comply with the provisions of the Act relating to the sale of poisons;
 - (c) he is of good character by submitting 2 recent testimonials to that effect; and
 - (d) he is over the age of 21 years.
- **3.** (1) If the Council is satisfied as to the content of an applica- Certificate tion under regulation 2, it may issue a certificate of registration as an of registraauthorised seller of poisons to the applicant.

- (2) A certificate of registration as an authorised seller of poisons must be in Form II as set out in the First Schedule.
- (3) A certificate of registration must be conspicuously displayed at all times on the premises where poisons are sold.

Suspension etc., of certificate.

- **4.** (1) The Council may at any time cancel or suspend for such time as it thinks fit a certificate of registration if it is satisfied that the holder of the certificate has failed to comply with any provision of the Act or these Regulations.
- (2) A certificate of registration which has been suspended or cancelled shall be immediately returned to the Council by the holder thereof, and such persons shall immediately cease to engage in the business of selling poisons.

5. The substances that are poisons for the purposes of the Act and to which these Regulations apply are set out in the *Second Schedule*.

6. An authorised seller of poisons shall, as a condition of the holding of a certificate under these Regulations, keep a register of poisons in the form set out in the *Third Schedule*.
