POST OFFICE (TELEGRAPH MONEY ORDER SERVICE) REGULATIONS, 1980

S.I. 1980/208.

Authority:

These regulations were made on 17th June, 1980 by the Minister under section 59 of the Post Office Act.

Commencement: 1st January, 1981.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Telegraph Money Order Service) Regulations, 1980.

- 2. Subject to any agreement between Barbados and the United Kingdom there exists a telegraph money order service between Barbados and the United Kingdom.
- 3. The maximum amount for which a telegraph money order may be issued is \$500.
- 4. (1) The remitter of a telegraph money order must, in addition to a commission at the rate specified in paragraph 2 of the Schedule to the Post Office (Money Orders) Regulassistions, 1980, pay

- (a) the cost of the telegram of advice at the ordinary or deferred rate per word from one country to another;
- (b) at the option of the country of issue, a supplementary fee to be fixed, and retained by that country.
- (2) A telegram of advice must be charged at the deferred rate and is subject to all the conditions governing the transmission of messages accepted at that rate and a form or a receipt or certificate of issue showing the amount of the remittance as well as the charges must be given to the remitter.
- 5. The remitter of a telegraph money order may add to the official telegram of advice any short communication in the English language that he wishes to send to a payee and may,

if he so desires, pay the cost of a telegraphic reply to such communication; but

- (a) any additional communication must be paid for at the at the rate referred to in regulation 4(1); and
- (b) the cost of the telegraphic reply must also be paid for rate referred to in that regulation.
- 6. All telegrams of advice for orders payable in the United Kingdom must be transmitted to the office of destination through the Central Telegraph Office in London and all telegrams of advice of orders payable in Barbados must be transmitted through Cable and Wireless (West Indies) Limited in Barbados.
