POST OFFICE (UNIFORMS) REGULATIONS, 1980

S.I. 1980/

Authority:

These regulations were made on 17th June, 1980 by the Minister under section 59 of the Post Office Act.

Commencement:

1st January, 1981.

- 1. These Regulations may be cited as the Post Office (Uniforms) Regulations, 1980.
- 2. (1) The Postmaster General may require certain employees attached to the Post Office to wear uniforms.
- (2) Where an employee is required to wear a uniform, that uniform must be supplied by the Crown and must be of such description as the Postmaster General with the approval of the Minister approves.
- (3) All uniforms remain the property of the Crown and must be returned by the user thereof to the Postmaster General if
 - (a) they are no longer serviceable;
 - (b) they are no longer required by the user; or
 - (c) the user ceases to perform functions in connection with the Post Office.
- 3. An employee who wears a uniform is entitled to an extra uniform and an extra pair of boots and must produce for inspection the uniform issued to him when required to do so by the Postmaster General or an officer acting under his authority.
- 4. (1) No employee may lend or dispose of any uniform and is liable for any loss or damage to any uniform used by him; and the amount of such damage is recoverable as a debt to the Crown in Civil proceedings before a magistrate.
- (2) The liability of an employee referred to in subparagraph (1) does not extend to the normal wear and tear resulting in the use of a uniform.

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5. Every employee to whom a uniform is assigned must, while he is wearing that uniform present a tidy appearance and must not wear private badges on that uniform unless the Postmaster General in a particular case so permits.
