**DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL
OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD
TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88
OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC
REGULATIONS, 1984**

1. These directions may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Barbados Rally Club "All Stage Rally") Directions, 2014*.
2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period:

On Sunday April 13, 2014

- (a) Between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as Orange Hill road, commencing from the junction with Prospect road and Indian Ground road, proceeding in a westerly direction on the said Orange Hill road, continuing in a southerly and south easterly direction on Four Hill road and finishing at the junction of Four Hill road and Indian Ground road.
- (b) Between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Lucy, the section of road known as Luke Hill commencing from its junction with Charles Duncan O'Neal Highway proceeding in a north easterly direction along Oxford Road and proceeding in an easterly direction to its junction with Mount Gay Road and continuing towards the road known as Alexandra proceeding in a westerly direction along Cottage and Pickering Roads finishing at the junction of Pickering Road and Highway 1C.

(c) Between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 2.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Lucy, the section of road known as Spring Garden road, commencing from the junction with Chance Hall road and Jemmotts road, proceeding in a northerly and south westerly direction on the said Spring Garden road, continuing in a northerly direction on the said Spring Hall road, proceeding in a westerly direction on Hope road and finishing at the junction of Hope road and Connell Town road.

3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform, commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.

4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
