DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, 1984

1. These directions may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Barbados Rally Club, "All Stage Rally") Directions, 2014.*

2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period on Saturday August 30, 2014

- (a) Between the hours of 1.00 p.m. and 12.00 midnight in the parish of Saint Thomas, the section of road known as Hangman's Hill commencing at its junction with Highway 2 (Hopewell), proceeding in a westerly direction along the said Hangman's Hill, continuing in a northerly direction on Duke's road and Canefield road, proceeding in a westerly and a northerly direction on the said Canefield road and finishing at the junction of Canefield road and Blunt's road.
- (b) Between the hours of 1.00 p.m. and 7.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Andrew, the section of road known as Haggatts road commencing from the junction with St. Simons's road, proceeding in a southerly direction along the said Haggatts road, continuing in a southerly direction along Cane Garden, Spring Vale and Bruce Vale roads, proceeding in a southerly direction on Chapman's Village road and finishing at the junction of Chapman's Village road and Bloomsbury road.

(c) Between the hours of 7.00 p.m. and 12.00 midnight in the parish of Saint John, the section of road known as Society road commencing from its junction with Highway H (Society Hill), proceeding in a north westerly direction on the said Society road, continuing in a southerly direction on Ashford road, proceeding in a westerly direction on Cherry Grove road, continuing in a northerly and north westerly direction on Roebuck Street road and finishing at the junction of Roebuck Street road and Pool road (Highway 3B).

3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.

4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
