**DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL
OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE
MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD
TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88
OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC
REGULATIONS, 1984**

1. These directions may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Barbados Rally Club, "International Stage Rally") Directions, 2012*.

2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period:

On Sunday, June 3, 2012

(a) Between the hours of 9:40 a.m. and 5:30 p.m. in the parish of Saint Thomas, the section of road known as Hangman's Hill commencing from its junction with Highway 2, proceeding in a westerly direction pass Vaucluse, continuing in a northerly direction pass Dukes, proceeding in an easterly direction pass Lion Castle and finishing at the entrance of the Lion Castle Polo Estate.

On Saturday, June 9, 2012

(b) Between the hours of 9:15 a.m. and 8:30 p.m. in the parishes of Saint Peter and Saint Lucy, the section of road known as Collins, commencing from the junction with Boscobelle, proceeding in a north westerly direction on the said Collins road continuing in a westerly direction on Alexandra road, proceeding in a westerly direction on Lamberts and Cottage roads and finishing at the junction with Pickerings road.

(c) Between the hours of 9:50 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as Mount Brevitor commencing from the junction with Highway 2A, proceeding in an easterly direction

pass French Village and in a southerly direction pass Prospect continuing in a westerly direction pass Orange Hill, proceeding in a south easterly direction pass the Rock and finishing at the junction with Four Hill.

- (d) Between the hours of 10:25 a.m. and 8:00 p.m in the parish of Saint Thomas, the section of road known as Lion Castle, commencing at the entrance of the Lion Castle Polo Estate, proceeding in an easterly and south westerly direction on Canefield and Dukes roads, continuing in a westerly direction on Dukes road to its junction with Dunscombe road, proceeding in an easterly direction on Fortress Hill, continuing in a north easterly direction on Dukes and Canefield roads, proceeding in a north westerly direction on Mount Misery road and finishing at the junction with Dunscombe road (Highway D).

On Sunday, June 10, 2012

- (e) Between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m in the parishes of Saint George and Saint John, the section of road known as Highway 4 commencing from the junction with Byre road, proceeding in a northerly direction on the said Highway 4, continuing in a westerly direction on Kendal and Ashford roads, proceeding in a westerly direction on Cherry Grove/Bowmanston road, continuing in a northerly direction on the Roeburn Street road and finishing at the junction with Pool road (Highway 3B).
- (f) Between the hours of 9:40 a.m. and 6:00 p.m in the parish of Saint Philip the section of road known as Stewart Hill commencing at the junction with Massiah Street, proceeding in an easterly direction on the said Stewart Hill road, continuing in a southerly direction on Supers road, proceeding in an easterly direction on Thicketts road, continuing in a southerly direction on Mapps road, proceeding in a westerly direction on

Sandford and Fairfield roads, continuing in a northerly direction on Bushy Park road, proceeding in a westerly direction on Harrow road and finishing at the junction of Harrow and Sunbury roads.

- (g) Between the hours of 9:40 a.m. and 5:30 p.m in the parish of Saint Philip, the section of road known as Bushy Park road, commencing from the junction with Congo road, proceeding in a north westerly direction on the said Bushy Park road, continuing in an easterly direction on Fairfield road and finishing at the junction of Mapps and Fairfield roads.

3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.

4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
