**DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL  
OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE  
MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD  
TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88  
OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC  
REGULATIONS, 1984**

1. These directions may be cited as the *Road Traffic (Barbados Rally Club, "Speed Event") Directions, 2019*.
2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period on Sunday April 7, 2019:
  - (a) Between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Lucy, the section of road known as Highway 2B commencing at its junction with Collins road, proceeding in a westerly direction along the said Highway 2B pass Lamberts Plantation, continuing in a south westerly direction on Lamberts road to the junction at Alexandra, proceeding in a northerly direction on Josey Hill and finishing at the junction with Mount View road.
  - (b) Between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as French Village road, commencing from the junction with Applegrove, proceeding in a south easterly and southerly direction on the said French Village road, continuing in a westerly direction on Orange Hill road, proceeding in a south easterly direction on Four Hill road and finishing at the junction of Four Hill and Indian Ground roads.

- (c) Between the hours of 9.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. in the parishes of Saint Andrew and Saint Peter, the section of road known as Turners Hall and Swans road, commencing from the junction with Bawden road, proceeding in a southerly direction on the said Turners Hall and Swans road, continuing in a westerly and north westerly direction on Rock Hall road, continuing in a westerly direction on Black Bess road and finishing at the junction of Black Bess and Mangrove roads.

3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of Five hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.

4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
