## DIRECTIONS GIVEN BY THE CHIEF TECHNICAL OFFICER WITH THE APPROVAL OF THE MINISTER RESPONSIBLE FOR ROAD TRAFFIC UNDER REGULATION 88 OF THE ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATIONS, 1984

- 1. These directions may be cited as the Road Traffic (Motoring Club Barbados, Inc. "Rally") Directions, 2010.
  - 2. The following roads will be closed during the specified period:

## On Saturday, September 11, 2010

- (a) Between the hours of 1.45 p.m. and 5.45 p.m. and between the hours of 6.45 p.m. and 11.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as Mount Brevitor, proceeding in an easterly direction along French Village Road, continuing in a southerly direction along Orange Hill Road, proceeding in an easterly direction along Four Hill Road and finishing at the junction with Roebuck Road.
- (b) Between the hours of 1.45 p.m. and 5.45 p.m. and between the hours of 6.45 p.m. and 11.00 p.m. in the parish of Saint Peter, the section of road known as Portland Road commencing from the junction with Welchtown, proceeding in a north easterly direction on the said Portland Road, continuing in a northerly direction on Diamond Corner Road, proceeding in an easterly direction on Boscobelle Road and finishing at the junction with Mount Road No. 2.

- 3. Any person who contravenes these directions or fails to comply with the orders given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform, commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500.00 or imprisonment for a term of six (6) months.
- 4. These rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Fire Service or any Ambulance Service.
