TRAFFIC CONTROL (BARBADOS WORKERS' UNION LABOUR DAY PARADE) RULES, 2017

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Barbados Workers' Union Labour Day Parade) Rules, 2017.*

- **2.** In these Rules,
- "alternate emergency route" means an alternate route which commences at Bay Street and proceeds along Beckles Road, Culloden Road, Lower Collymore Rock, Ena Walters Roundabout and Martindales Road to Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;
- "band" means any group of persons organised as a tee-shirt band by the various business establishments and approved by the Barbados Workers Union to participate in the Labour Day Parade;
- "emergency route" means a route which commences at Bay Street and proceeds along Jemmott's Lane, Ena Walters Roundabout and Martindales Road to Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or

(c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Monday, 1st May, 2017;

- "route" means a route which commences at the Main Guard and proceeds along the Garrison, Garrison Road, Dalkeith Road, Dalkeith Hill, Culloden Road, Pine Road, Welches Road, Tweedside Road, Roebuck Street, Crumpton Street, St. Michael's Row, Bridge Street, Probyn Street and Bay Street to the National Conservation Facility at Brownes Beach in the parish of Saint Michael;
- "vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, between 09:00 hours and 12:00 hours, bands may parade along the route starting at the Main Guard and ending at Brownes Beach in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. On the relevant date, between 09:00 hours and 12:00 hours, the route shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date, between 09:00 hours and 18:00 hours no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Bay Street;
- (b) Beckles Road;
- (c) Jemmott's Lane; and
- (d) Chelsea Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in these Rules shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

7. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

8. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
