**TRAFFIC CONTROL
(BUJU BANTON LONG WALK TO FREEDOM SHOW) RULES, 2019**

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Buju Banton Long Walk To Freedom Show) Rules, 2019*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate emergency route” means an alternate route which commences at President Kennedy Drive and proceeds along Fontabelle Road, Cheapside Road, Broad Street, Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge, Fairchild Street, River Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at President Kennedy Drive and proceeds along Westbury Road, Passage Road, Country Road, Roebuck Street, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“public service vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 27th April, 2019;

“relevant period” means the period from 18:00 hours on Saturday, 27th April, 2019 to 05:00 hours on Sunday, 28th April, 2019; and

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Buju Banton Long Walk To Freedom Show will take place at the Kensington Oval, President Kennedy Drive in Bridgetown.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Fontabelle Road, from its junction with Lakes Folly and Redman Drive to its junction at President Kennedy Drive and Holborn Circle, in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be a one-way street with vehicular traffic travelling in the direction of the Spring Garden Highway.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, vehicular traffic, with the exception of public service vehicles, shall travel one-way along President Kennedy Drive, from its junction with Westbury Road to its junction with Holborn Circle, in the parish of Saint Michael, in the direction of the Spring Garden Highway.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall park or allow the vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads or the adjoining footpaths except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Cheapside Road;
- (b) Fontabelle Road;
- (c) Kensington New Road;

- (d) Pickwick Gap;
- (e) Prescod Boulevard;
- (f) President Kennedy Drive;
- (g) Redman Drive;
- (h) Spring Garden Highway;
- (i) University Row; and
- (j) Westbury Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

7. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the emergency route or the alternate emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

8. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 4, 5, 6 and 7 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform

9. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months or to both.

10. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
