TRAFFIC CONTROL (CEREMONIAL DELIVERY OF THE LAST CANES) RULES, 2009

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

- 1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Ceremonial Delivery of the Last Canes) Rules*, 2009.
 - 2. In these Rules,

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Sunday, 28th June, 2009;

- "route" means Queen's Park, St. Michael's Row, Bridge Street, Charles Duncan O'Neal Bridge, Lower Fairchild Street and Independence Square in the parish of Saint Michael.
- 3. On the relevant date, between 15:00 hours and 18:30 hours, the Ceremonial Delivery of the Last Canes Ceremony will take place at Independence Square in Bridgetown in the parish of Saint Michael.
- 4. On the relevant date, between 15:00 hours and 15:30 hours, a procession will take place commencing at Queen's Park in the parish of Saint Michael and will proceed along the route.

- 5. On the relevant date, between 14:00 hours and 19:00 hours,
- (a) Bay Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Cavans Lane;
- (b) Cavans Lane from its junction with Lower Bay Street;
- (c) Lower Fairchild Street from its junction with Bridge Street to its junction with Bay Street; and
- (d) the Chamberlain Bridge

in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to through traffic.

- 6. On the relevant date, between 14:00 hours and 19:00 hours, Bay Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Jemmotts Lane shall be ONE WAY going in a southerly direction towards the Garrison, in the parish of Saint Michael.
- 7. On the relevant date, between 14:00 hours and 19:00 hours, no person shall drive, park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:
 - (a) Bay Street,
 - (b) Cavans Lane,
 - (c) Upper Fairchild Street,
 - (d) Lower Fairchild Street,
 - (e) Bridge Street,
 - (f) Broad Street,
 - (g) Probyn Street,

- (h) Jemmott's Lane, and
- (i) St. Michael's Row,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

- 8. On the relevant date, between 14:00 hours and 19:00 hours, vehicles shall turn left only exiting the following roads onto Bay Street,
 - (a) Wellington Street,
 - (b) Beckwith Street,
 - (c) Combermere Street, and
 - (d) Jemmott's Lane,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

- 9. Drivers of vehicles bearing the label marked 'V.I.P.' in black on a blue background shall be allowed to park in the car park of the Barbados Tourism Investment Incorporated at Lower Bay Street in the parish of Saint Michael.
- 10. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 6 months.
- 11. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Fire Service, the Barbados Defence Force or to any emergency vehicle.
