TRAFFIC CONTROL (COHOBLOPOT) RULES, 2013

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Cohoblopot), Rules 2013*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate route” means an alternate emergency route which commences at Fontabelle and proceeds along Cheapside, Broad Street, Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge, Fairchild Street, River Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means an emergency route that commences at President Kennedy Drive and proceeds along Westbury Road, Passage Road, Country Road, Roebuck Street, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“Festival Committee” means the Crop Over Festival Committee of the Ministry responsible for Culture, Sports and Youth;

“relevant period” means the period from 16:00 hours on Sunday, 4th August, 2013 to 02:30 hours on Monday, 5th August, 2013;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. During the relevant period, Kensington New Road to its junction with Fontabelle Road to its junction with Holborn Circle, in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.
4. During the relevant period, President Kennedy Drive from its junction with Westbury Road to its junction with Holborn Circle, in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.
5. During the relevant period, no person shall be allowed to park along Princess Alice Highway from its junction with Cowell Street to its junction with Harbour Road in the parish of Saint Michael.
6. During the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads or on the adjoining footpaths except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:
 - (a) Baxters Road;
 - (b) Eagle Hall Road;
 - (c) Fontabelle Road from its junction with Lakes Folly to its junction with President Kennedy Drive;
 - (d) Kensington New Road;
 - (e) Prescod Boulevard;
 - (f) President Kennedy Drive;
 - (g) Redman Drive;

- (h) Spring Garden Highway; and
- (i) Westbury Road from its junction with President Kennedy Drive to its junction with Baxters Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

7. During the relevant period, Fontabelle Road shall be a one-way street from its junction with Redman Drive to its junction with Holborn Circle, in the parish of Saint Michael, and traffic shall flow in 2 lanes towards Holborn Circle.

8. During the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the alternate route or the emergency route, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

9. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified, in paragraphs 3, 4, 6 and 7 or any of the routes specified in paragraph 8 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform.

10. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

11. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
