**TRAFFIC CONTROL (INDEPENDENCE ECUMENICAL  
SERVICE) RULES, 2009**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Independence Ecumenical Service) Rules, 2009*.

2. In these Rules,

“relevant date” means Sunday, 22nd November, 2009.

3. On the relevant date, the Independence Ecumenical Service will be held in Independence Square, commencing at 16:00 hours.

4. On the relevant date between 15:00 hours and 19:00 hours, Fairchild Street from its junction with Bay Street to its junction with Probyn Street in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date between 15:00 hours and 19:00 hours, Bay Street from its junction with Wellington Street to its junction with Cavans Lane in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

6. On the relevant date between 15:30 to 18:00 hours, the Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

7. On the relevant date between 15:00 to 19:00 hours, vehicles will not be allowed to park on Bay Street, Fairchild Street, Bridge Street or Wellington Street.

8. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in these Rules shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

9. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 6 months.

10. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Fire Service or any ambulance service.
