**TRAFFIC CONTROL (INTERNATIONAL CRICKET
COUNCIL WORLD TWENTY20 CHAMPIONSHIP)
(FINALS) RULES, 2010**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (International Cricket Council World Twenty20 Championship) (Finals) Rules, 2010*.

2. In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Sunday, 16th May, 2010;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act* Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date between 11:30 hours and 19:00 hours, the Finals of the International Cricket Council World Twenty20 Championship will be held at the Kensington Oval.

4. On the relevant date between 09:30 hours and 21:00 hours, Fontabelle Road from its junction with President Kennedy Drive to its junction with Lakes Folly in the parish in Saint Michael shall be one way to vehicular traffic and the vehicular traffic shall flow towards Bridgetown in the parish of Saint Michael.

5. On the relevant date between 09:30 hours and 11:30 hours and between 19:00 hours and 21:00 hours, President Kennedy Drive from its junction with Fontabelle Road to its junction with Westbury Road in the parish of Saint Michael shall be closed to vehicular traffic.

6. On the relevant date between 08:30 hours and 21:00 hours no person shall park a vehicle along:

- (a) Baxters Road;
- (b) Exmouth Road;
- (c) Fontabelle Road;
- (d) Kensington New Road;
- (e) President Kennedy Drive;
- (f) Redman Drive;
- (g) Samuel Jackman Prescod Boulevard;
- (h) Spring Garden Highway;
- (i) University Row;
- (j) Westbury Road;
- (k) Westbury New Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

7. During the relevant date, all drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using the roads specified in these Rules shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or to any emergency vehicle.
