TRAFFIC CONTROL (JUNIOR KADOOMENT) RULES, 2014

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Junior Kadooment) Rules, 2014*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate emergency route” means an alternate route which commences at the National Stadium and proceeds along Butler’s Avenue, Spooners Hill, Green Hill, Everton Weekes Roundabout, Clyde Walcott Roundabout, Norman Niles Roundabout, My Lord’s Hill Road, Welches Road, Belmont Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“band” means any group of persons organised as a costume band by the Festival Committee and approved by the Minister responsible for Culture, Sports and Youth, to participate in the Junior Kadooment Parade;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at the National Stadium and proceeds along Bank Hall, Country Road, Roebuck Street, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

(a) the Barbados Red Cross;

(b) the Department of Emergency Management; or

(c) an ambulance service;

“Festival Committee” means the Crop Over Festival Committee of the Ministry responsible for Culture, Sports and Youth;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 26th July, 2014;

“relevant period” means the period from 08:00 hours to 14:00 hours;

“route” means a route that commences at Stadium Road and proceeds along Codrington Road and Bush Hall Road, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, bands may parade only along the route starting and ending at the National Stadium in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period,

(a) Codrington Road, from its junction with Stadium Road to its junction with Bush Hall Road; and

(b) Stadium Road, from its junction with Codrington Road to its junction with Bush Hall Main Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except those vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

(a) Bow Road;

(b) Bush Hall Main Road;

- (c) Butler's Avenue;
- (d) Codrington Road; and
- (e) Waterford Road,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the emergency route or the alternate emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 4 and 5 or any of the routes specified in paragraph 6 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of any offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
