**TRAFFIC CONTROL (PAN PUN DE SAND) RULES, 2013**

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Pan Pun de Sand) Rules, 2013*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate route” means an alternate emergency route which commences at Brighton Road and proceeds along Black Rock Road, Bank Hall Road, Eastmond Corner, Hindsbury Road, Harmony Hall, Halls Road, Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means an emergency route which commences at Spring Garden Highway and proceeds along Exmouth Gap, Westbury Road, Passage Road, Country Road, Roebuck Street, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“Festival Committee” means the Crop Over Festival Committee of the Ministry responsible for Culture, Sports and Youth;

“relevant date” means Sunday, 14<sup>th</sup> July, 2013;

“relevant period” means the period from 12:00 hours to 22:00 hours;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Spring Garden Highway from its junction with Brighton Road to its junction with Exmouth Gap Road, in the parish of Saint Michael, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic except vehicles used by members of the Festival Committee.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on Brighton Road, from its junction with the Spring Garden Highway, in the parish of Saint Michael, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the alternate route or the emergency route, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

6. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraph 3 and 4 or the routes specified in paragraph 5, shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform.

7. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform commits an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

**8.** These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
