TRAFFIC CONTROL (PAN IN DE CITY) RULES, 2013

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Pan in de City) Rules, 2013*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate route” means an alternate emergency route which commences at Speightstown and proceeds along Queen Street, in the parish of Saint Peter, Highway I, via Holetown, in the parish of Saint James, to Spring Garden Highway, Fontabelle, Cheapside, Broad Street, Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge, River Road, Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means an emergency route which commences at Farm Road, in the parish of Saint Peter, and proceeds along Highway 2A, Warrens, Lodge Hill, Green Hill, Codrington, Waterford, Station Hill Road, Halls Road, Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 13th July, 2013;

“relevant period” means the period from 12:00 hours to 22:00 hours;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Pan in de City will be held at the Speightstown Esplanade in the parish of Saint Peter.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Queen Street from its junction with Major Walk Road to its junction with Church Street, in the parish of Saint Peter, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park along the following roads:

- (a) Church Street;
- (b) Major Walk Road;
- (c) Queen Street; and
- (d) Sand Street,

in the parish of Saint Peter.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the alternate route or emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

7. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads or routes specified in these Rules shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform.

8. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Royal Barbados Police Force in uniform is guilty

of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

9. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Royal Barbados Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
