TRAFFIC CONTROL (REGGAE ON THE HILL)
RULES, 2012

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Reggae on the Hill) Rules, 2012*.

2. In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Sunday 29th April, 2012;

“relevant period” means from 06:00 hours to 22:00 hours on Sunday 29th April, 2012;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act* Cap. 295.

3. On Sunday 29th April, 2012, during the relevant period, Reggae on the Hill will be held at the Farley Hill National Park in the parish of Saint Peter.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Alleynedale Road;
- (b) Benn Hill Road;
- (c) Diamond Corner Road;
- (d) Indian Ground Road;
- (e) Mile and A Quarter Road;
- (f) Pleasant Hall Road;
- (g) Portland Road;
- (h) Prospect Road; and
- (i) Welchtown Road

in the parish of Saint Peter.

5. During the relevant period, all drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraph 4 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

6. On the relevant date between the hours of 09:00 hours and 21:00 hours, Portland Road shall be a one-way road with all traffic travelling towards Shorey Village in the parish of Saint Andrew.

7. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

8. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
