**TRAFFIC CONTROL (ROYAL BARBADOS POLICE
FORCE 175TH ANNIVERSARY MARCH)
RULES, 2010**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Royal Barbados Police Force, 175th Anniversary March) Rules, 2010*.

2. In these Rules,

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant period" means from 14:00 hours to 16:30 hours on Friday 5th March, 2010.

3. During the relevant period, a march will commence at Cheapside moving along the route to Fairchild Street in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. During the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on the following roads, except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Bridge Street;
- (b) Broad Street;
- (c) Chapel Street between Cumberland Street and Prince Alfred Street;
- (d) Cheapside Road between Redman Drive Road and Chapel Street;
- (e) Fairchild Street;
- (f) Prince Alfred Street between Chapel Street and Broad Street;
- (g) Probyn Street; and
- (h) Trafalgar Street,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

5. During the relevant period, the following roads shall be closed to all vehicular traffic:

- (a) Bridge Street from its junction with St. Michael's Row Road to its junction with Wharf Road;
- (b) Broad Street from its junction with Prince Alfred Street to its junction with High Street;
- (c) Chapel Street from its junction with Cumberland Street to its junction with Prince Alfred Street;

- (d) Cheapside Road from its junction with Redman Drive Road to its junction with Cumberland Street;
- (e) Charles Duncan O'neal Bridge from its junction with Wharf Road to its junction with Fairchild Street;
- (f) Lower Bay Street from its junction with Probyn Street to its junction with Lower Fairchild Street;
- (g) Lower Fairchild Street from its junction with Bay Street to its junction with Probyn Street;
- (h) Prince Alfred Street from its junction with Chapel Street to its junction with Broad Street;
- (i) Probyn Street from its junction with Fairchild Street to its junction with Lower Bay Street; and
- (j) Trafalgar Street from its junction with High Street to its junction with High Street,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. Drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified, in paragraphs 4 and 5 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

7. A person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

8. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or to any emergency vehicle.
