TRAFFIC CONTROL (SANDY LANE GOLD CUP) RULES, 2019

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Sandy Lane Gold Cup) Rules, 2019*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate emergency route” means an alternate route which commences at Garrison Road and proceeds along Hasting Road, Bay Street, Jemmotts Lane and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at Garrison Road and proceeds along Dalkeith Road, Culloden Road, Lower Collymore Rock and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“public service vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 2nd March, 2019;

“relevant period” means from 12:00 hours to 19:00 hours; and

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the Sandy Lane Gold Cup will be held at the Garrison Savannah, in the parish of Saint Michael.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, vehicular traffic, with the exception of public service vehicles, shall travel one-way around the Garrison Savannah with the Garrison Savannah on the right.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on the following roads or routes except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Garrison Road;
- (b) Dalkeith Road;
- (c) Dayrells Road;
- (d) Bush Hill Road; or
- (e) Bay Street,

in the parish of Saint Michael.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on the following roads or routes except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Harts Gap Road; or
- (b) Hastings Road,

in the parish of Christ Church.

- 7.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the emergency route or the alternate emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.
- 8.** All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 5 and 6 or any of the routes specified in paragraph 7 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.
- 9.** Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.
- 10.** These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, or the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
