TRAFFIC CONTROL (SOCA ROYALE)
RULES, 2010

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Soca Royale) Rules, 2010*.

2. In these Rules,

"emergency route" means Oughterson Road, Church Village Road, Ebenezer Road in the parish of Saint Philip, Windsor Road, Highway 5, Boarded Hall Road, South District Road in the parish of Saint George, Mapp Hill Road, Government Hill, Welches Road, Belmont Road and Martindales Road in the parish of Saint Michael;

"emergency vehicle" means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

"relevant date" means Sunday 25th July, 2010;

"relevant period" means from 06:00 hours to 22:00 hours;

"vehicle" has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*. Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Bushy Park Road shall be a one-way street from its junction with Congo Road to its junction with Parish Land Road with traffic flowing towards Parish Land in the parish of Saint Philip.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no driver or person in charge of a vehicle shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads or adjoining footpaths except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Bushy Park Road from its junction with Congo Road to its junction with Parish Land Road;
- (b) Congo Road;
- (c) Fairfield Road;
- (d) Farm Road;
- (e) Gaskin Road;
- (f) Oughterson Road;
- (g) Padmore Village Road; or
- (h) Parish Land Road

in the parish of Saint Philip.

5. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 3 and 4, shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

6. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

7. These Rules do not apply to

- (a) vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service; or
- (b) any emergency vehicle.
