**TRAFFIC CONTROL (SOCA ON THE HILL) RULES, 2014**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Soca on the Hill) Rules, 2014*.

2. In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Emergency Management Department; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Sunday, 20<sup>th</sup> July, 2014;

“relevant period” means the period from 09:00 hours to 22:00 hours; and

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Soca on the Hill will be held at the Farley Hill National Park in the parish of Saint Peter.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on any of the following roads except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers:

- (a) Benn Hill Road;
- (b) Diamond Corner Road;
- (c) Indian Ground Road;
- (d) Mile and A Quarter Road;
- (e) Pleasant Hall Road;
- (f) Portland Road;
- (g) Prospect Road; and
- (h) Welchtown Road

in the parish of Saint Peter.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, all drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraph 4 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

6. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable, on summary conviction, to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

7. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
