**TRAFFIC CONTROL (SPEIGHTSTOWN MARKET & PAN AROUND
DE TOWN) RULES, 2016**

The Commissioner, in exercise of the power conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Speightstown Market & Pan Around De Town) Rules, 2016*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate emergency route” means an alternate route which commences at Speightstown and proceeds along Queen Street in the parish of Saint Peter, Highway 1, via Holetown, in the parish of Saint James to Spring Garden Highway, Fontabelle Road, Cheapside Road, Broad Street, Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge, River Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at Farm Road, in the parish of Saint Peter and proceeds along Highway 2A, Warrens Road, Lodge Hill Road, Green Hill Road, Codrington Road, Waterford Road, Station Hill Road, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

(a) the Barbados Red Cross;

(b) the Department of Emergency Management; or

(c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 9th July, 2016;

“relevant period” means from 10:00 hours to 22:00 hours;

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Speightstown Market & Pan Around De Town will be held at Speightstown in the parish of Saint Peter.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Queen Street from its junction with Major Walk Road to its junction with Chapel Street in the parish of Saint Peter shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Church Street from its junction with Speightstown By-Pass Road to Eddie’s Supermarket in the parish of Saint Peter shall be a two-way street.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Major Walk Road, from its junction with Speightstown By-Pass Road to its junction with Queen Street in the parish of Saint Peter shall be a one-way street with traffic travelling in a westerly direction.

7. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Sand Street, from its junction with Queen Street and Major Walk Road to its junction with Speightstown By-Pass Road in the parish of Saint Peter shall be a one-way street with traffic travelling in a northerly direction.

8. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park a vehicle on any of the following roads:

(a) Major Walk Road;

(b) Queen Street;

- (c) Church Street;
- (d) Godding's Alley;
- (e) Mango Lane;
- (f) Chapel Street; and
- (g) Sand Street,

in the parish of Saint Peter.

9. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the emergency route or the alternate emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

10. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 4, 5, 6, 7 and 8 or any of the routes specified in paragraph 9 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

11. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

12. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
