**TRAFFIC CONTROL  
(THE PRINCE OF WALES AND THE DUCHESS OF CORNWALL  
VISIT TO BRIDGETOWN) RULES, 2019**

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

**1.** These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall Visit to Bridgetown) Rules, 2019*.

**2.** In these Rules,

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Tuesday, 19<sup>th</sup> March, 2019;

“relevant period” means from 08:00 hours to 15:00 hours; and

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road Traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

**3.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, The Prince of Wales and The Duchess of Cornwall will visit the Parliament of Barbados, National Heroes Square and the Nidhe Israel Synagogue in Bridgetown.

**4.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, the following roads in Bridgetown shall be closed to all vehicular traffic:

- (a) Broad Street;
- (b) High Street;
- (c) Marhill Street;
- (d) Palmetto Street; and
- (e) Wharf Road.

**5.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Fairchild Street to the Charles Duncan O'Neal Bridge shall be closed to vehicular traffic.

**6.** On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary on the following roads in Bridgetown:

- (a) Bridge Street;
- (b) Broad Street;
- (c) Charles Duncan O'Neal Bridge;
- (d) Fairchild Street;
- (e) High Street;
- (f) James Street;
- (g) Magazine Lane;
- (h) Prince Alfred Street;
- (i) St. Michael Row;
- (j) Shepherd Street;
- (k) Synagogue Street;
- (l) Trafalgar Street; and

(m) Wharf Road.

**7.** All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in paragraphs 4, 5 and 6 shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

**8.** Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months or to both.

**9.** These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, or the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
