TRAFFIC CONTROL (SPEIGHTSTOWN SIZZLIN') RULES, 2017

The Commissioner of Police, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 23(2) of the *Police Act*, with the approval of the Minister, makes the following Rules:

1. These Rules may be cited as the *Traffic Control (Speightstown Sizzlin') Rules, 2017*.

2. In these Rules,

“alternate emergency route” means an alternate route which commences at Speightstown and proceeds along Queen Street, in the parish of Saint Peter, Highway 1, *via* Holetown, in the parish of Saint James, to Spring Garden Highway, Fontabelle Road, Cheapside Road, Broad Street, Charles Duncan O’Neal Bridge, River Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency route” means a route which commences at Farm Road, in the parish of Saint Peter, and proceeds along Highway 2A, Warrens, Lodge Hill, Green Hill, Codrington Road, Waterford Road, Station Hill, Halls Road and Martindale’s Road to the Queen Elizabeth Hospital, in the parish of Saint Michael;

“emergency vehicle” means a vehicle used by

- (a) the Barbados Red Cross;
- (b) the Department of Emergency Management; or
- (c) an ambulance service;

“relevant date” means Saturday, 15th July, 2017;

“relevant period” means from 16:00 hours to 23:00 hours; and

“vehicle” has the meaning assigned to it by section 2 of the *Road traffic Act*, Cap. 295.

3. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Speightstown Sizzlin’ will be held at the Speightstown Esplanade in the parish of Saint Peter.

4. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Queen Street, from its junction with Major Walk Road to its junction with Goddings Alley, in the parish of Saint Peter, shall be closed to all vehicular traffic.

5. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Church Street, from its junction with Speightstown By-Pass Road to Eddie’s Supermarket, in the parish of Saint Peter, shall be a two-way street.

6. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Major Walk Road, from its junction with Speightstown By-Pass Road to its junction with Queen Street, in the parish of Saint Peter, shall be a one-way street with traffic travelling in a westerly direction.

7. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, Sand Street, from its junction with Queen Street and Major Walk Road to its junction with Speightstown By-pass Road, in the parish of Saint Peter, shall be a one-way street with traffic travelling in a northerly direction.

8. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park a vehicle along:

- (a) Chapel Street;
- (b) Church Street;
- (c) Goddings Alley;

- (d) Major Walk Road;
- (e) Queen Street; and
- (f) Sand Street,

in the parish of Saint Peter.

9. On the relevant date, during the relevant period, no person shall park or allow a vehicle to remain stationary along the emergency route or the alternate emergency route except for the purpose of picking up or setting down passengers.

10. All drivers and riders of vehicles, pedestrians and riders or leaders of animals using any of the roads specified in these Rules shall exercise caution and shall comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform.

11. Any person who contravenes these Rules or fails to comply with any order given by a member of the Police Force in uniform is guilty of an offence and is liable on summary conviction to a fine of \$500 or to imprisonment for a term of 3 months.

12. These Rules do not apply to vehicles used by the Police Force, the Barbados Defence Force, the Barbados Fire Service or any emergency vehicle.
